

# Honoring our Legacy

In 2024, the Tri-Cities Family YMCA continued to serve thousands of community members while raising \$7.5 million for the largest capital improvement project in our history. The Y For All project will modernize our facility and support critical repairs and upgrades to ensure the Y's sustainability. We still need to raise \$2.5 million to reach our goal.

## 2024 Outcomes

Here's how we impacted our community in our three focus areas.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT: nurturing the healthy physical and emotional development of all Tri-Cities youth.



More than 3,000 youth participated in lessons, classes, camps and league opportunities. Generous donor support ensured no child was turned away for an inability to pay.



1.590 kids stayed unplugged and active by attending our summer and school break camps.



**2,597** children reduced their risk of drowning through swim lessons and water safety training.



231 children ages 2–5 prepared for kindergarten through our Learning Tree Preschool.

**HEALTHY LIVING:** facilitating efforts to improve the health and wellness of residents by reducing health disparities and increasing preventative wellness programs.



10,000 community members participated in Y programs, events and services.



847 older members stayed active, reduced isolation and improved long-term health by working out and participating in 18 classes per week specifically designed to improve functional aging.



Through a partnership with Ottawa County Community Mental Health, 25 memberships were made available to consumers seeking to improve their mental health by engaging in physical activity.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY: fueling a culture of service and philanthropy while strengthening the bonds of our community.



**22.000** free snacks and meals were provided to boost food security and address hunger.



Over 200 individuals and families were approved for membership discounts through our Community






**Total Revenue**
